This unique day camp is designed for children 7–14 years old who have experienced the death of one or both parents. Employing several different areas of the performing arts, the program encourages communication, fosters emotional growth, and provides the consolation of friendship and compassion.

- Camp is held Monday – Friday from 9am – 4pm
- Session 1 (Chicago's Roosevelt University), July 5–16, 2010, is for campers ages 7–11
- Session 2 (Chicago's Roosevelt University), July 19– July 30, 2010, is for campers ages 10–14

AVAILABLE STAFF POSITIONS

Assistant Camp Director*

The Assistant Camp Director provides overall leadership and management for HTHTA campers, staff, and families. The ACD is responsible for staff supervision, behavior and discipline issues with campers, caregiver questions and concerns, and the helpful facilitation of a safe and positive camp environment. The preferred candidate will be a certified teacher with a strong background in classroom management, be a creative team player, have an appreciation for the arts, and promote the values and beliefs of HTHTA. Experience dealing with children and grief is a plus.

Resource Room Manager*

The Resource Room is a quiet, safe spot in which campers can find refuge when things get too emotionally or physically intense during the camp day. The Manager of the room is responsible for assessment of behavioral situations campers may encounter and helps boost the morale and success of each child. His or her presence extends from the Resource Room to many areas of camp. He or she oversees the Leadership Circle for returning campers, encouraging and supporting their daily development. The Manger also provides pre and post-care supervision.

Group Leader*

Responsible for the safety of 8–12 campers for the entire camp day, Group Leaders make every effort to develop relationships with each child in their care. In addition to logistical responsibilities like monitoring bathroom breaks, movement from one activity to the next, lunch care and coordination, and facilitation of camper sign in and out, Group Leaders are integral to the creation of a fun and energetic camp atmosphere.

Area Head*

Area Heads in Dance, Drama and Music are responsible for their area and the teachers within it. He or she monitors teaching plans and curriculum as well as preparing campers to confidently perform selected pieces in the talent show and final performance. Each Area Head is expected to create a 20–25 minute piece for the final performance in addition to communicating with each other and their staff to create the most comprehensive experience possible.

Teacher/Specialty Counselor*

Teachers are considered specialists in their area of expertise – music, theatre or dance. As such, he or she is expected to complete a teaching plan for each lesson under the guidance of their Area Head. High quality classes are expected on a daily basis and every effort should be made to make connections with campers while having fun.
